

Declaration of [REDACTED]

I [REDACTED], am a [REDACTED].

From 1986 through July 1991, I was a Special Agent with the United States Air Force, stationed at George AFB (GAFB), Victorville, CA. I was assigned to Detachment 1802. My supervisor was Special Agent [REDACTED].

During 1990 or 1991, as part of my duties, I was assigned an investigation into a complaint by a local citizen, Frank Vera, that he had suffered some physical ailments after having been riding his bike through the desert on the Southern portion of GAFB when he came across a 55 gallon drum of a jelly like substance. Mr. Vera placed either his hand or his arm in the substance. Shortly there after, Mr Vera began suffering from adverse health which he attributed to this event. Mr. Vera suspected the drum may have contained some type of radioactive material.

I recall interviewing him during the investigation, conducting some interviews of the base environmental personnel and reviewing some documents related to potential hazards that were known to the Air Force at that time. I recall there being some issue of cathode ray tubes, which contained low level radio active contaminants having been dumped in this area, munitions being deposited of in this area and other chemicals, the name of which at this time I cannot recall.

I do recall generating some kind of report or memo regarding the investigation, although I cannot recall the specifics at this time. I do not recall the conclusions of the report or memo.
